RESPONSE AND ACTION TOWARDS 'COMMUNITY PREPAREDNESS AND RESILIENCE' TO THE NOVEL CORONA VIRUS (COVID-19) GLOBAL PANDEMIC

Nagaland State Rural Livelihoods Mission (NSRLM), Rural Development Department is present in 1241 Villages under the 74 RD Blocks across 11 Districts. The Mission Management Units at the State, Districts and Blocks are supported by more than 600 development professionals. NSRLM has a customized Human Resource policy of recruiting only indigenous tribe of the representative Districts. Over the last 8 years, the State Mission has been able to develop 1963 village based Community Cadres (CCs). Accordingly, 110788 rural Households have been mobilized into 12003 Self Help Groups (SHG) and their 716 Village Level Organizations (VLO), and 22 Cluster Level Federations (CLF).

In the wake of the Novel Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19), NSRLM has been entrusted with the task of building community resilience through SHG networks, by the State Government, for '*Community Based Preparedness and Response*' in partnership with Health & Family Welfare Department (F&FW) and Nagaland State Disaster Management Authority (NSDMA).

With the nation-wide lockdown and subsequent advisories from the GoI and GoN, the State Mission formed Core Teams (*Annexure II*) for emergency response at the State, District and Block Mission Management Units. The Core teams are working closely with the District Task Forces-NSDMA which is headed by the Deputy Commissioners (DC) and Chief Medical Officers (CMO).

While also adhering to the advisory of social distancing and proper hygiene practices, required passes are procured from Deputy Commissioner by the core team, to facilitate collection of relevant material for onward delivery to all the villages across Nagaland.

Daily Situation Reports (SitReps) of Community Response activities through the SHGs network and it's Federation, are being reported since 23rd March 2020. As of today 11 Districts, 74 Blocks, 1229 Villages have been covered with the following emergency activities:

1. 96524 households have been covered thus far through IEC approach on Proper Hygiene and Hand Wash, Pamphlets on Do's and Don't, Social Distancing and Home Safety
2. 16668 households have received PPEs (Mask and Hand Sanitizer).
3. 325 Traditional Bamboo Pole Water Dispenser, Hand Wash Stations have been installed in 87 villages. Installation of additional 2316 hand wash station in 1158 villages is underway.
4. 28354 Vulnerable Persons have been provided with essential materials from the Vulnerable Reduction Fund, and own savings of the SHGs and their Federations. The collective expenses incurred is Rs. 42 lakhs.
5. SHGs and their VLOs are assisting in the upkeep of 1036 community quarantine centres.
6. 24207 SHG members have accessed entitlement through PMGKY amounting Rs. 165.13 lakhs.
7. SHGs have supplied 64430 kg of Agri produce and 10381 kg of livestock & Fish to the market for onsite as well as home delivery. The collective income earned is Rs. 53.64 lakhs

Besides the aforementioned activities, the SHG and its Federation are also engaged in joint monitoring of members quarantined at the villages, and effectively contributing towards construction of traditional thatched quarantine homes.

NSRLM-RD is also actively engaged in the COVID 19 Warroom where the progress in 'Community Response' verticals (<https://covid19.nagaland.gov.in/cbr-main>) is being populated through monitoring of real time COVID 19 activities in the villages. The SHGs and its networks continue to be effective partners in building community resilience across villages in Nagaland.

The following are the detailed documentation of the SHGs' social services in the global fight against COVID-19.

1. Outreach: Awareness and Preparedness

The Village Level Organisation (VLO) Leaders and Community Cadres (CCs) are engaged for Collection of IEC materials at Village Gates and Entry Points. Along with the support of the Village Councils (VCs), Village Development Boards (VDBs), Student Union, Church Leaders, ASHAs, and ANMs, correct dissemination of COVID 19 information is done through Home Visits and other social platforms; announcement through Public Address (PA) systems like megaphone. Also, the SHGs, VLOs and their CCs have developed audio and video messages, and leaflets on social distancing, hand wash hygiene and home stay in their respective dialect, which is disseminated to the community. Dissemination is aggressively done through telephone, social media platform (WhatsApp) and also hand written information brochures. To ensure adequate copies of IEC is available for the communities, printing additional copies is being undertaken by NSRLM as per requirement. Through the rich network 12003 SHGs they have been able to reach out to 1.10 lakhs rural households till date, with special focus on the vulnerable members in the village, besides sanitizing public places.

Restriction of outsiders' entry to the villages have been enforced with support from the village functionaries. Essential commodities are being supplied to the villages through Task Force team deployed in all the villages, Blocks and Districts by the Government of Nagaland.

2. Production and Supply of Mask and Hand Sanitizer

With the accelerated widespread adoption of wearing protective masks and using hand sanitizer across the country for reducing the chances of inhaling the virus, supply of mask and hand sanitizer in the market became limited and expensive. The SHGs and their Federation promptly jumped in to provide their services for mass production in convergence with District Administrations and Medical Department.

Currently, SHGs members have taken up the initiative of stitching standardized masks as per the GoI homemade mask manual. The production of the mask is self-funded, while, some are done in collaboration with the administration. 112533 masks have been produced thus far by the SHGs which has been distributed freely to the frontline workers and community members.

A sudden rise in the demand for hand sanitizers and non-availability in stores have pushed the SHGs and VLOs in production of home-made sanitizers as per H&FW guideline for free distribution. However, availability of the raw material being limited, the VLOs have produced 32 litres

hand sanitizers thus far. And this has been distributed to administration team and frontline workers.

3. Food Security and Essentials Supplies

With the current lockdown, procurement of essential commodities has become challenging, particularly, in the rural area. With the objective of assisting the community members in need, the SHGs and their VLOs have initiated collection of essentials like food grains-rice, wheat, pulses, lentils, grams; salt, sugar, milk powder, tea leaf, edible oil; seasonal vegetables and fruits; spring water; firewood; fish, poultry, meat; biscuits; soaps, detergent powder, and

disinfectant (Dettol). A mix of these essentials are distributed to the community through home visits, particularly to vulnerable households, the daily wage earners, labourers, and to the Village Guards (VGs) on duty at the village gates and other entry points.

In villages where there are fair price shop or other grocery shops, utmost care is taken for ensuring social distancing through designated marked area and hand wash facility for safety and minimizing chances of contamination.

4. Quarantine Homes

In response to the COVID-19 advisories from the Government, community-based facilities for quarantine homes have been identified by the Village Councils in most of the villages. Thus far, 651 persons who have travel history have been quarantined. The SHGs and their Federation, and the Village Council are jointly monitoring members quarantined at the villages. To ensure there is no inadvertent transfer of the virus, the community is also encouraged to self-quarantine if they suspect they have been unknowingly risked to persons with travel history so that they do not infect anyone. Prompt referral mechanisms are also done jointly with ASHAs and ANMs. And as part of sanitation initiative, the SHGs and VLOs takes turns to clean and disinfect the quarantine homes periodically, while also providing food essentials periodically.

Since quarantine is not the only way to protect oneself during a pandemic, and the health risk being a paramount concern in the rural areas, adherence to social distancing, using protective mask, cooperating with the authorities, and staying home is emphasized to the community through door to door visits and via telephone by the SHGs and their VLOs.

5. Installation of Bio-friendly Bamboo Pole Water Dispenser as Hand Wash Facility

Bamboo is abundantly available in Rural Nagaland. Seeing that house to house dissemination on proper hand hygiene also needs to be complimented with hand wash facility in strategic public places of common gatherings and entry points in the village, the SHGs and their VLOs with the support of the village functionaries have come up with a bio-friendly home-grown solution by installing bamboo pole hand-wash facility equipped with soap and water dispenser, with hand hygiene pamphlet in local dialect. The SHGs and volunteers take turns to refill the water dispensers. So far SHGs/VLOs have installed 325 units of bamboo hand wash facility in 87 villages. 2316 hand wash station in 1158 villages is underway.

6. Facilitating Access to Financial Services

1. In response to the Government of India's key economic package to limit the human and economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic to the poor and vulnerable communities in the Country, the SHGs and their VLOs under NSRLM are accessing Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana (PMGKY). Till date, 24207 SHG members have accessed entitlement through PMGKY amounting Rs. 165.13 lakhs.

To mitigate the financial stress caused by COVID-19 to poor and vulnerable groups in their village, SHGs and their VLOs are responding by providing cash to them from the VRF and their savings to tide over immediate household needs.

7. Extended Moratorium Period

As a result of the lockdown the ongoing income generating activities taken up through the Community Investment Fund has been largely affected causing inability to women farmers to pay the loan taken. The State Mission is ensuring a moratorium period of 3 months post 1st March 2020 to help our women farmers tide over during this trying time.

Community cohesion is intricately woven in the social fabric of the Nagas, and thus, in this crucial juncture of fight against COVID-19, the State Mission is prepared and committed to continue its response with urgency and determination to prevent and contain the outbreak through the SHGs and their VLOs with active support/participation of all village functionaries, i.e. Village Councils, Village Development Boards, student bodies, churches, community health workers, and other frontline workers.

DIMAPUR: As the nation and the world struggles to contain further spread of COVID-19, Nagaland government and its agencies are seen taking all preventive measures to keep the virus away from the state. In last few days, several directives, precautionary measures and information have been disseminated to create awareness so as to prevent possible outbreak.

Public transport, places to be disinfected: Deputy commissioner (DC) Dimapur, Anoop Khinchi has directed the owners of all public and private carriers which includes buses, taxis, autorickshaw, two wheelers etc in the district to regularly disinfect and clean the seats, door handles, railings, surfaces etc. DC has further directed all municipal councils, town councils and urban stations to regularly clean and disinfect all public places.

Biometric exercise suspended: Deputy commissioner (DC) Dimapur, Anoop Khinchi has directed all enrollment activity where biometric records of the fingers are being taken under Aadhaar Enrollment Agency to be temporarily suspended as precautionary measure in view of COVID-19 outbreak.

SAG on COVID-19: A review meeting of the special action group (SAG) on COVID-19 was held under the chairmanship of home commissioner, Abhijit Sinha, at his office chambers on Saturday. According to an official bulletin, the meeting discussed various preparatory measures and steps taken by the state government to contain the spread of the virus.

The Health and Family Welfare (H&FW) principal director, Dr. Vizolic Suokhrie, reiterated that every individual entering the state should contact COVID-19 helpline no: 7005435243, 9856071745, 7005539653 and toll free no: 1070 or Email: nlsu.idsp@nic.in and mandatorily self-quarantine for a minimum of 14 days. He also informed that intensive care units (ICUs) and isolation wards have been set up in all the District Hospitals and all the medical surgeons (MSs) have been directed to prepare for expansion of isolation wards in their respective hospitals if and when required. Nagaland State Disaster Management Authority (NSDMA) OSD, Jonny Rongmei, informed that awareness information and advisories on COVID-19 have been prepared in various local languages to be dispatched to all the districts of the state. Nagaland State Rural Livelihood Mission would act as a network channel through the self help groups (SHGs) to disseminate the information to all the villages in the state. SAG listed few other advisories and stringent measures to be adopted which the home commissioner would notify after the approval of higher authority.

NSRLM Longmatra SHG members playing key role to contain COVID-19

KIPHIRE, MAY 1 (MEXN): The women SHG members under NSRLM, Longmatra Block Kiphire District have been playing key role in the State Government's effort to contain COVID-19.

Atsope Sangtam, BPM, NSRLM BMMU Longmatra in a press release stated that starting from second week of March 2020 the SHG members were assigned the responsibilities of creating awareness on COVID-19 at the community level. They took responsibilities to circulate IEC materials on how to combat coronavirus along with NSRLM Staff under the block. The rural people were

made understand in simple language the dos and don'ts, the importance of social distancing and the importance of staying home to break the transmission chain and to defeat coronavirus. The SHG members also take initiative in

making masks and distributed it to the community free of cost. Due to outbreak of pandemic many poor and needy were effected amid lockdown as such the women Village Organizations also provides relief materials like rice,

potatoes etc to the needy and daily wage earners in the block. The RD Department involving NSRLM through the coordination with the District Administration has also procured various locally produced vegeta-

bles from SHGs under Kiphire and Longmatra Block and was sold in shift bazaar, which was temporarily arranged by the District Administration Kiphire, on alternate days. The products were brought by the department from the spot and were sold voluntarily by the NSRLM Staff Kiphire in the market.

On May 1, the NSRLM staff showed gratitude by distributing green vegetables free of cost to all the frontline workers assigned on duty to fight COVID-19. The packages were arranged by the SHGs especially for frontline workers to show their solidarity and it was done as per the advice of the SHGs.

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NSRLM reaches out to help villages in Bhandari

DIMAPUR, MAY 3 (EMN): Social Action Committees formed by various SHGs and VLOs under NSRLM-RD, Bhandari Block, Wokha district has launched a campaign to distribute essential items.

Those involved, through their own earnings and personal savings, are catering to vulnerable groups at villages in their area.

A press release informed that till date, the group has provided essential items such as face masks, hand sanitisers, as well as food items such as rice, sugar, eggs, salt, mustard oil, milk powder, wheat flour, dal, fish, pork meat, lamb meat, Dettol soaps to over 150 households.

Altogether, over 400 village households have been the recipients of their altruistic and benevolent initiative. The NSRLM-VLO social action committees that were present or engaged in the distribution of the essential items include AWWs, ASHA workers, VLO presidents, VFCum MBK, community cadres, and SHGs members.

Besides rendering yeoman services, the Social Action Committees were also instrumental in other community services such as in the dissemination and sensitisation of IEC materials on COVID-19 through social media platforms, text messages and telephonic conversations.

In addition to this, they played a

The committees have also been instrumental in assisting village councils to disseminate the advisories issued by the State Home Department to refrain from hunting or consuming any wild meat, especially wild boar, civet etc.

It was meanwhile informed that procurement of agricultural products is currently underway to facilitate sustainable market linkage for affected farmer communities despite the challenges of Bhandari block being located at the border with Assam.

"These community service activities and philanthropic work carried out by the SHGs were a pure display of altruism. Their services were voluntary and without any obligation or compulsion. Their selfless courage in putting their own lives on the line is really intriguing. Their gallant efforts for the betterment of mankind in itself has created a social vaccine," said Chichan-thung Shitri, Area coordinator (SISD) NSRLM, RD department, Bhandari Block, Wokha.

He further commended those involved and that their voluntary service for humanity, against all odds, and their efforts as responsible citizens in improving the quality of lives of the families, neighbourhood, the local community and the society at large is commendable.

Core committee catering to essential needs in Mkg



The core committee for essential commodities has been working out logistics to ensure the supply of essential goods to people of the district during the lockdown period

Mokokchung district constituted a Core team on essential commodities when the lockdown was announced on March 25. The core team on essential commodities comprises of eleven members headed by the ADC, Mokokchung, Mokokchung Municipal Council, Mokokchung Chamber of Commerce and Industries (MCCI) and various NGOs including Ao Students' Conference and Mokokchung Town Lanur Telongjem.

The main purpose of setting up the core team on essential commodities was to focus on catering to the needs of the people of Mokokchung as well as the adjoining districts who depend on Mokokchung market for the supply of essential commodities. The core team also takes the responsibility of communicating and co-ordinating with the sourcing market, Jorhat.

People can purchase or sell in bulks only after obtaining an approval list from the core team.

The team monitors the price, co-ordinates with the buyers and sellers and also looks into 'ambitious shopping list' of the people.

"We make sure that the people of Mokokchung are not hoarding the essential commodities because we also need to think of the neighbouring districts who buy commodities from Mokokchung," said Tsuki Longkumer, President MCCI and member of the core team.

The team informed that apart from the daily buyers from towns and villages adjacent to

Mokokchung, main towns like Zunheboto, Wokha and Tuensang also started sourcing their essential commodities from Mokokchung town.

When asked what were the main challenges faced by the team, Longkumer said that the biggest challenge was maintaining a balance in the demand and supply of goods in market. "With different churches, village councils and NGOs carrying out Good Samaritan projects, many essential items were purchased in bulks and while some people were receiving aids in ten folds, some villages were finding it difficult to even procure the minimum needs of the village."

"The increase in demand of goods than the supply led to price escalation in the Jorhat market which led to an increase in the prices of the essential commodities in the Mokokchung market," he informed.

"With the government advising everyone to stay home and stay safe, another challenge was convincing the truck drivers and truck owners," the team said.

The drivers and owners were briefed on health, hygiene and maintaining cleanliness and were provided with food and necessary equipments to fight the virus.

"They are our real heroes and letting them know that made things easier for us," said Tsuki Longkumer.

The Core team on Essential commodities also looks after the inter-state and inter-district movement of essential commodities vehicles. They have also issued ID cards to the drivers and security personnel.

So far, the Core team has closed 6 shops, five essential commodities shops and one livestock shop for not adhering to the rules and regulations laid out by the Core team on essential commodities.

"Not many people understand the market dynamics and mechanism. We just want to send out the message to the people that there is no need to panic and hoard because doing that only creates barrier in demand and supply," the core team said.

Mokokchung Cart donates to needy

Meanwhile, the Mokokchung Cart Home delivery service initiated by the District Administration Mokokchung donated fresh vegetables and pulses to more than a hundred families in Mokokchung Town by delivering it to their doorsteps.

EAC Mokokchung and Nodal Officer for Mokokchung Cart, Sentilong Ozukum said that the home delivery of fresh vegetables project was initiated to meet the needs of some genuine needy families in the town who had been identified by the volunteers and delivery personnel.

For more than a month, according to DIPR report, the Mokokchung Cart Team has been relentlessly trying to find market for the local farmers who could not sell their vegetables during the lockdown by going and picking up the vegetables from the villages and selling the vegetables through the Mokokchung Cart App.

The Mokokchung cart App is powered by delivery personnel from Online Express, such as the Trail Hounds team who have been home delivering essential commodities, medicines and vegetables by following strict COVID-19 protocol.

The Nodal Officer expressed appreciation to the Horticulture Department for donating crates for storing the vegetables, Mokokchung Town Lanur Telongjem for donating cotton delivery bags, Team Impact Marep, Mokokchung for donating paper carry bags for use during the delivery and also NSRLM Mokokchung, SHGs for coordinating with the local farmers.

DIMAPUR: As the nation and the world struggles to contain further spread of COVID-19, Nagaland are seen taking all preventive measures to keep the virus away from the state. In last few days, several directives, precautionary measures and information have been disseminated to create awareness so as to prevent possible outbreak.

Public transport, places to be disinfected: Deputy commissioner (DC) Dimapur, Anoop Khinchi has directed the owners of all public and private carriers which includes buses, taxis, autorickshaw, two wheelers etc in the district to regularly disinfect and clean the seats, door handles, railings, surfaces etc. DC has further directed all municipal councils, town councils and urban stations to regularly clean and disinfect all public places.

Biometric exercise suspended: Deputy commissioner (DC) Dimapur, Anoop Khinchi has directed all enrollment activity where biometric records of the fingers are being taken under Aadhaar Enrollment Agency to be temporarily suspended as precautionary measure in view of COVID-19 outbreak.

SAG on COVID-19: A review meeting of the special action group (SAG) on COVID-19 was held under the chairmanship of home commissioner, Abhijit Sinha, at his office chambers on Saturday. Nagaland State Rural Livelihood Mission would act as a network channel through the self help groups (SHGs) to disseminate the information to all the villages in the state. SAG listed few other advisories and stringent measures to be adopted which the home commissioner would notify after the approval of higher authority.

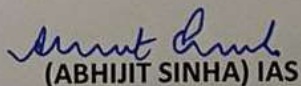

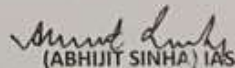

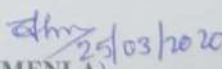

In pursuance to the Chief Secretary Order NO.CSO/GAB-1/COM/GEN-1/2020, dated Kohima the 24th March 2020, and in the interest of public health and safety, and to continue to prevent and contain the spread of Novel Corona Virus (COVID-19), Government has ordered for total shutdown across the State with immediate effect from 25th March 2020 for a period of 21 days. Accordingly, the following is to be applicable for all the Mission Management Units at the State, Districts and Blocks:

1. The Core Teams of the District and the Blocks are to work in close coordination with the Deputy Commissioner (DC) and also need to acquire necessary passes from the DC, specifically for the purpose of reaching the IEC materials to the Villages.
2. Henceforth, only the Community Cadres (CC) will be responsible for disseminating the IEC materials at the Village, while also ensuring adherence to the advisory of social distancing and proper hygiene practices.
3. Specific details and contents of the IEC materials will be disseminated to the CCs or Village Level Organisations (VLO) leaders or Self Help Group (SHG) members wherever applicable, and monitoring of field dissemination to be done through phone calls.
4. Upon completion of the village coverage, the Core Teams shall work from home, and keep the concerned authorities at the District and the State Mission Management Unit (SMMU) informed of the progress via emails and WhatsApp only.
5. The Core Teams shall meet on emergency or as directed by the District Administration on need basis only.
6. The Core Teams' engagement in emergency response may request for Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs) like N 95 Mask and Hand Sanitizers from the DC/CMO, as per need.
7. Explore production of face masks at village level by SHGs:
 - SHG Members may take interest free loans to purchase sewing machines (at least 1-3 in every village).
 - Identify SHG members who have the skill to use the sewing machines.
 - Coordinate with CMO Office for the type of cloth material which can be locally made and used as protective masks.
 - As per cost incurred on investment in this activity, reasonable pricing can be decided along with the Village Councils (VCs), to be sold at the Village.
 - For procurement of material from vendors, the core team may take necessary assistance from the District Administration as per need.

All Core teams are directed to adhere to the advisory of social distancing and personal hygiene practices while performing their duties.

As per categorization of geographies into zones, community institutions in green zones may conduct meetings following protocols (mentioned in 'Booklet of Instructions for NSRLM Community Institutions' to be disseminated soon) and staff must ensure all SHG members are properly trained on preventive measures as per MHA and MH&FW guidelines
3. Preparation and repeat of MCPs are advised for ascertaining credit needs of SHGs.
4. SHGs may be advised that BC Sakhi/Digipay Sakhi who are involved in disbursement of PMGKY and other DBT during lockdown period be provided loan from SHGs on priority for their settlement account till 30th September, 2020 for catering high volume of transaction loads
5. Emphasizing need for risk coverage of every HH, SHG members and one of the major earning members of the family should be covered under life and accidental insurance (PMJJBY & PMSBY) with regular follow-up.
6. VLOs/CLFs must be assigned to prepare list of eligible households, particularly poor and vulnerable households and households of returned migrant labourers to ensure availing of ration cards. The list must be shared with the VCs and also the BMMUs for compilation and consolidation at DMMU for further submission to the SMMU.

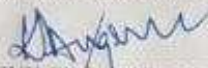
